JUVENILE HALL AUXILIARY

The Juvenile Hall Auxiliary is a non-profit volunteer organization designed to help the at-risk youth in our community. The Juvenile Hall Auxiliary was founded in 1955 to provide a different kind of support for the disadvantaged youth in the County who are wards of the court including foster care youth. As a volunteer-driven organization with only one part-time staff person at least 90 percent of the funds raised by Auxiliary members go into direct programming. The Juvenile Hall Auxiliary's goals are to provide both physical plant improvements and enhancements at the institutions and personal assistance to the youth they house. Our message to these young people is that the "*community cares*" about them and supports their re-integration into society as productive citizens.

We are currently supporting (22) young people with their education goals, including two stars; David is finishing up at Boalt Hall School of Law and will be taking the bar this year and Jason is in Milwaukee, WI starting his PhD program in Human Movement Sciences.

COMMUNITY YOUTH CENTER (CYC)

The Community Youth Center (CYC) is a state-of-the-art sports and academic center where youth ages 3 to 18 thrive in a dynamic and positive environment. The caring CYC staff and volunteers work hard every day to support young student athletes. The CYC is proud to manage 9 sport programs, an academic program, and an outdoor activities program.

The CYC is staffed with outstanding coaches who specialize in delivering quality instruction and genuinely care about kids. CYC is proud to emphasize that it offers recreation-based classes; however, the CYC also offers competitive team training opportunities for those hoping to excel at a higher level.

Sports help to develop key characteristics and behaviors in youth, and if done correctly can build a foundation for success in life. A key to success is balance between sports and academics. At the CYC, we offer tutoring to our athletes. The Academic Excellence program is designed to augment athletes' existing studies and to help them manage their time effectively so they may become even better students and athletes.

THE SHERIFF'S LAW ENFORCEMENT EXPLORER PROGRAM

The Sheriff's Law Enforcement Explorer Program is designed for young adults who wish to experience the field of Law Enforcement with a unique perspective, while helping to improve the community they live in.

The Contra Costa County Sheriff's Explorer program is chartered through the Boy Scouts of America and managed by the Sheriff's Emergency Services Support Unit. Members participate in two monthly meetings and average two community events each month. Through this combination of training and experiences, members of the Explorer Post are able to apply the techniques that they have been taught.

Sheriff's Explorers receive continuous training related to law enforcement and other emergency services applications. Explorers utilize their training by attending Explorer Competitions and assisting in community events throughout the County. Sheriff's Explorers that are 18 years and older, have the opportunity to further their law enforcement training by attending the Reserve Deputy Sheriff's Academy, which is held twice per year.
